\$1,323,758 compared to \$3,085,376 for March 2024. The average Gross Patient Revenue
per day for March was \$57,170.77 compared to \$38,339.09 for March 2024. Days COH
as of March 31, 2025, was 92.71 days. Total Operating Expenses for March were
\$929,019.10, giving us an expense per day of \$29,302.20. Our Gross AR days were 58.3
compared to 65.4 for the same period last year. Our patient registrations (encounters)
were 1330 for March, compared to 1257 for March of last year. Patient Gross Service
Revenue for March was \$1,742,125 compared to March 2024's gross revenue of
\$1,179,742. Discounts and allowances were \$710,549 versus March 2024's Discounts and
Allowances of \$1,434,055. Bad Debt and Charity Care write-offs for March were
\$129,969 compared to \$878,605 for March 2024. Inpatient days are 47, ER visits are 132,
and Clinic visits are at 598.

EXECUTIVE REPORTS

DON – It has expanded from when I pulled this data. Hard to anticipate month to month along with send outs. 9.8% is normal. We kept 8 patients this last month which is 6%. We had 143 ER patients and their median length of stay is 120 minutes as this varies. 163 hours of observation, 20 days inpatients, and 41 days swing bed. Our goal is to have those numbers level. Reviewing swing bed referrals with Shelley as they come. Sometimes we run into problems with insurance. We have lots of current projects we are working on like sterile kits with what everyone needs in them. Working with Billings Clinic on getting the EKG results to flow into Cerner. We have four nurses going to NBHH for different types of education and filling classes. We had Nereo and stroke teams come down and give a presentation. The Trauma team from Billings Clinic came down and are getting the nurses TNCC. Tomorrow there is a POC Ultrasound training for providers and will be back next week as well. We are still working on stroke and behavioral work flows. Teresa has been accepted to CWC nursing program. Has a nurse start back with us. May 5th a new nurse will start. We have completed two interviews. Trauma there is a criteria for our facility to consider a trauma activation. Handed out a paper that has a list of those who may qualify. The first quarter of 2024 for our Traumas were 13 and this year in the first quarter it was 18. In 2024 our activations were 8 and this year they were 12. There is a survey that we do as well for Trauma. Completing our education and competency through Healthstreams. CTO- Compliance report. Our Employee of the Month is Ronee Freier, "I would like to nominate Ronee Freier as employee of the month. Ronee has been such a great addition to the clinic and the facility! She is always coming up with new ideas and ways to improve

<u>CEO-</u> With Kelsey not here I can speak and ask questions on behalf of the sleep studies.		
Billings Clinic has limited resources on an overnight sleep study. Medicare has approved		
at home equipment. We would purchase equipment. The patient would meet with our staff		
with their order. They would take our equipment and see the provider for the results and		
then establish with our providers for their sleep without driving really far. Jeff – This		
would be a good thing for our community. Mike S. – Is Billings Clinic the closest facility		
if there needs to be more extensive care or research? Dr. Robertson – Billings Clinic Cody		
is the closest as they have sleep rooms and is staffed with sleep technologist. That is		
where we would do a lot of our follow-ups. Sarah from Billings Clinic is wonderful. The		
sign by the highway is updated. We had a 8-12% growth in ER visits. Property sale:		
Looking for direction on where to go with it. Jeff – Can we give the property to the		
foundation. Joel – If the property does not sell the board could donate it. There is no tax		
advantage to it. We want no hostility with the other landowners and have been in contact		
with all involved. Mike S. – Can the hospital go into a different route of revenue like		
bonds? Joel – If the board managed the process it could work. We hope to have the		
facility master planning committee meet with Mitch and myself before the end of the		
fiscal year. We will present the operating budget for next fiscal year at the next meeting.		
We will also have the presentation for the 22-23 audits in May. We haven't received		
federal approval for tax exempt status. This meeting will be pushed to a later date.
